Hespeler Minor Hockey - Over 80 Years of Community Hockey

You would be hard pressed to find anywhere in Canada the hockey tradition that is associated with the community of Hespeler and the Hespeler Minor Hockey Association.

Hespeler Minor Hockey Association first appeared in OJHA (OMHA) competition as early as the 1936-37 season. This means that Hespeler is one of the oldest organizations in the OMHA which first formed in the 1934-35 season.

As early as 1910 photos exist of new Irish "home children" immigrants to Canada playing hockey on the Coombe residence on Guelph Avenue.

In the photo you will notice the kids using hockey sticks made a block away at the Hespeler Wood Specialties factory. Opening in 1905, it still operates as Heritage Wood Specialties Incorporated. It is the oldest operating hockey stick factory in the world.

In the 1960s and 70s you would be hard pressed to find someone that did not use a Hespeler brand hockey stick made at the Sheffield street plant.


The HMHA is well known for its Hespeler Olympics tournament that has been held for the last 50 years.

The Hespeler Minor Hockey Association today has a complete Learn to Play and house league program from CHIP through to Juvenile Divisions. Their travel teams complete in the OMHA and their house league teams play in a competitive local league.
